Where are we going?

What are we going to see?

Students will be participating in a multiple-session experience—tour, classroom session, primary source investigation, and performance—about the Civil War.

What Program will we see?

The Price of Freedom

In this tour, students contemplate whether the Civil War was worth the cost to our nation through a variety of activities. Students formulate their own answer to this essential question as they role play as a Civil War soldier in Atlanta History Center's Turning Point exhibition and make realistic, vital decisions that could affect their character's life. Moving on to explore the Civil War through the eyes of Enslaved people, students experience the risk some people took to secure their own freedom through the lens of Abolitionists Harriet Jacobs. Later, in an inquiry-based classroom activity, students use critical thinking skills as they examine primary sources to discover why the South seceded from the Union.

How long is the program?

Duration: 2 hours (not including lunch)

TO DO TASKS for your school's trip

- **3.** You have the option to have **lunch on your trip.** Please indicate if you will have lunch on your transportation request AND coordinate with your school's cafeteria. Please note that the lunch area provided is outdoors. *If it rains, students will have to eat on the bus or back at school.*
- **4.** Distribute your school's approved **field trip parent permission form**.
- **5.** Coordinate your **Chaperones**. See more information on Chaperones below.

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	6. If your student numbers have changed since your 10-day count, please notify <u>Hrabed@fultonschools.org</u> ASAP prior to your field trip.
Chaperones	Required Chaperones: The ratio for chaperones is 1 chaperone* for every 10 students. This is the minimum # of chaperones required by Fulton County. The Kaleidoscope Program will cover the expense of these chaperones and their transportation on FCS buses.
	Additional Chaperones: If your school is sending more the 1 chaperone per 10 students, their admission and transportation must be paid for by the school or the individual. To purchase additional chaperone admissions, please contact Mary Wilson, mwilson@atlantahistorycenter.com or 404.814.4110.

Lunch During Your Trip	School tours can have lunch on site. However, please know that lunch space is only available outdoors (first come, first served) . In the case of inclement weather, lunches can either be eaten on the bus or back at school. School box lunches must be left on the bus until lunch time.
Museum Etiquette	Museum Rules: Students must stay with their group at all times. An adult must accompany any and all students if they leave for any reason. Please keep your hands to yourself. Help us preserve museum artifacts for future generations! No gum, food, or drinks are allowed in the museum. These guidelines apply to outdoor tours, as well as indoor tours.
